

Solid Waste: How to Dispose and Recycle Batteries

With billions of batteries sold each year in the United States, Public Services: Solid Waste Division would like to remind everyone that some batteries can be safely thrown in the trash, while other types must be recycled.

Batteries, if disposed of improperly, can release heavy metals and toxic substances into the air and water. It can also cause fires in the City's garbage trucks, which can be dangerous and costly.

Did you know not all batteries can be thrown in the trash?

Some must be recycled in order to prevent fires.

Types of Batteries to Trash

- Alkaline Batteries
- Lantern Batteries
- Lithium Batteries (Tape the terminals before throwing away)

- Rechargeable Lithium Ion Batteries (LI-ion)
- Battery Packs
- Button Batteries
- Nickel-Cadmium Batteries (Ni-Cd)
- Nickel Metal Hydride Batteries (NiMH)
- Old-style Cell Phone Batteries
- Portable Power Tool Batteries
- Small Sealed Lead Acid Batteries
- Wet Cell Lead Acid Batteries

As the colder weather approaches, the Apopka Fire Department wants to remind you of the dangers of carbon monoxide (CO). CO is an odorless gas that can escape from any fuelburning appliance, such as a gas furnace, water heater, stove, fireplace, chimneys, or space heater.



Here are some tips to keep your household safe:

- Install CO alarms outside sleeping areas and every level.
- Know the sound of the CO alarms and test monthly.
- If the alarm sounds, immediately move to fresh air and call for help.
